Healthcare: Successful Safe Patient Handling Programs

This topic reviews components of ergonomic programming in safe patient handling and movement programs for healthcare workers. A conceptual framework is provided for developing a written process for safe patient handling, focusing on staff motivation to use the equipment and develop commitment to the program.

Safety Programs for Small Business

Implementing a workable safety and health program can reduce these risks and provide a safe and healthful work environment for employees.
